## Sacraments

**Baptism:** English Baptisms will be officiated on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church. Spanish Baptisms will be officiated on the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month at 1:30 PM in the Church.

Contact the Parish Office to schedule. Attendance at Baptism class is mandatory. The Baptism must be scheduled before you attend Baptism class.

**Marriage:** Weddings celebrated Saturdays and Friday evenings, but not Sundays. You must contact a priest 9 months before the planned date, and reservation of a wedding time is suggested even earlier.

**Confirmation, First Eucharist, First Penance:** Though immediate preparation is given before receiving these sacraments, children are expected to receive a Catholic upbringing in their families. This includes formal religious education classes and regular Sunday worship in the years prior to and following the reception of these Sacraments.

## Devotions

**Marian Novena:** Saturdays following 8:15 AM Mass in the Chapel.

**Eucharistic Adoration:** First and Second Friday, Adoration following 8:30 AM Mass; Benediction: 1st Friday in English; 2nd Friday in Spanish, 12:00 PM in the Chapel.

## In the Hospital?

## New Parishioners

## Sponsorship Eligibility

**To be or not to be . . . A Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation**

The opportunity to walk with another in Faith, whether a child or an adult is an awesome privilege. It is cause for serious consideration on the part of those who ask another to witness with their lives to what it means to be a Catholic, and for those who accept this responsibility. It is important to think carefully about your selection and decision. The person to be considered a Sponsor must be at least 14 years of age and have themselves completed the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation), and are leading a life in harmony with the Faith and Tradition they are called to witness. A Godparent/Sponsor cannot be the mother or father of the one to be baptized. If married, their marriage must be recognized as "valid" by the Catholic Church. They must be attending Mass regularly, that is, every Sunday and Holy Day of Obligation.

**They will need to obtain a Certificate of Eligibility signed by their pastor.** Being properly registered at one's parish is an important first step. Consider carefully your invitation and response. There is more involved to this than simply standing at the Baptismal Font. It is a lifelong commitment. If you have questions, speak with one of the parish priests who can guide you correctly. Call the Parish Office EARLY, even before your child's birth to obtain information that will help you in selecting suitable godparents.

## The History of Mass Intentions

A mass may be offered for many reasons, such as in thanksgiving for another person, or as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

When a priest offers Holy Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently and validly in accord with the norms of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the good of the whole Church. Third, to offer the Mass for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

### History

Pope Leo XIII beautifully elaborated this point and emphasized the connection between the communion of saints with the Mass. The communion of saints is the mutual sharing of help, atonement, prayers and benefits among the faithful.

*We find not only the origins of this practice dating to the early Church but we also clearly recognize its importance.*

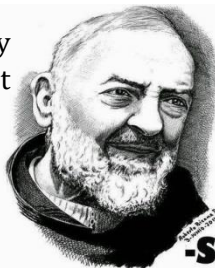
The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, originates in the very early Church. Inscriptions discovered on tombs in Roman catacombs of the second century evidence this practice.

St. Cyril of Jerusalem (d. 386), explained how at Mass both the living and dead are remembered, and how the Eucharistic Sacrifice of our Lord is of benefit to sinners, living and dead.

St. Ambrose (d. 397) preached, "We have loved them during life; let us not abandon them in death, until we have conducted them by our prayers into the house of the Lord."

St. Augustine (d. 430) recorded the dying wishes of his mother, St. Monica in his Confessions: "One thing only I ask you, that you remember me at the altar of the Lord wherever you may be."

Finally, Pope St. Gregory (d. 604) said, "Let us not hesitate to help those who have died and to offer our prayers for them."

## La Historia de Intenciones de las Misas

Una misa puede ser ofrecida por muchas razones; ejemplo, en acción de gracias por un familiar, o por el eterno descanso del alma de alguien que ha muerto. Cuando un sacerdote ofrece la Santa Misa, tiene tres intenciones: En primer lugar, para ofrecer la misa con reverencia y válidamente de acuerdo con las normas de la Iglesia. En segundo lugar, ofrecer la misa en unión de toda la Iglesia y para el bien de la misma Iglesia. En tercer lugar, para ofrecer la misa por una intención particular, como el eterno descanso del alma de alguna persona que ha muerto.

### Historia

El Papa León XIII bellamente elaborando este punto hizo hincapié en la conexión entre la comunión de los santos con la Misa.

La comunión de los santos es el intercambio mutuo de ayuda, la expiación, oraciones y beneficios entre los fieles. La tradición de ofrecer misas por los demás, particularmente por los difuntos, se origina en la misma Iglesia primitiva. Inscripciones descubiertas en Catacumbas romanas del segundo siglo evidencia esta práctica.

San Cirilo de Jerusalén (m. 386), explicó que en la Misa los vivos y los muertos son recordados, y cómo el Sacrificio Eucarístico de nuestro Señor es de beneficio para los pecadores, vivos y difuntos.

San Ambrosio (m. 397) predicó: "Les hemos amado durante la vida; no los abandonemos en la muerte, hasta que lleguen por nuestras oraciones hasta el templo del Señor."

San Agustín (. 430 d) registró los últimos deseos de su madre, Santa Mónica en sus Confesiones: "Sólo una cosa pido que se acuerde de mi ante el Señor, donde quiera que se encuentren".

Por último, el Papa San Gregorio (m. 604) dijo: "No dudemos de ayudar a los que han muerto y ofrecer nuestras plegarias por ellos."

## Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor



La festividad del Bautismo del Señor, fiesta que se celebra el domingo siguiente a la Epifanía y con la que se cierra el Tiempo de Navidad, comenzando el Tiempo Ordinario, en que meditamos en Cristo, Salvador del mundo.

El bautismo en el Jordán fue para Jesús dejar la vida silenciosa de Nazaret y el comienzo de su misión mesiánica. Isaías habla del **elegido** que promoverá el derecho y la justicia, curará y librerá. El "elegido" fue investido como Mesías en las aguas del Jordán donde se escuchó la palabra del Padre.

En muy poco tiempo la liturgia nos hace pasar de la cuna a la madurez.

Cristo estuvo preparándose para su misión durante 30 años, una misión que consistió en hacer cercano al hombre el Reino de Dios.

A lo largo de esos años Jesús fue descubriendo su identidad. Para descubrirlo, Jesús siente una llamada especial, es lo que hoy recordamos en la fiesta de su Bautismo.
